A MESSAGE FROM SESSION

Session met on November 19th and reviewed two letters with mixed emotions. The Presbyterian Investment & Loan (PILP) shared the unhappy news that our 2-year adjustable-rate mortgage is going up from 2.897% to 5.535% in December. That means an increase of \$636.64 per monthly mortgage payment. On a happier note, a letter from Lehigh Presbytery informed us that we will receive a lump sum of \$42,893.70 to be used for paying down our mortgage, either as a one-time payment on principal or as a cushion to pay monthly payments for the next year. It is a bittersweet gift since the funds come from the sale of the Presbyterian Church in Mahoning City that closed. We are contacting PILP to see if we can get a rate adjustment and explore what options for payment are best for us.

The building's gutters have been cleaned and repaired, \$2,700 was raised from Bacon Fest parking, and options for renting the second floor continue to be explored. The Mission Team has several events scheduled in the next few months that will help in our outreach to the community. These will be highlighted in the weekly bulletins.

We are looking for volunteers to receive ServSafe manager training to keep our commercial kitchen license. The cost is \$189, and the church will pay the cost. We particularly want a Deacon and a Mission Team member to be certified. Contact Noralee Manzek if you are interested.

The Stewardship Team received the 2024 pledges on November 12th. Session is grateful to all who pledged their time, talent and treasure, and we thank you. If you haven't turned in your pledge, please consider doing so soon. The pledges received determine the budget for next year, including basic operations, programs, mission, and mortgage. Let's continue to pull together!

The Outreach/Membership Team has seen a major increase in traffic and engagement on our Facebook page. Since October 7th we have been posting at least once a day on FB and Instagram and sharing on FB groups like "Everything Easton" and "Easton, PA". Please look at our FB page and share the content with your friends so we can expand our reach.
