from the Bible, time to reflect on God's
message to you, and a question for
reflection during the day.

A MESSAGE FROM SESSION

The first session meeting with Rev, Vernon "Larry" Van Hise moderating was held on June 19th. In addition to welcoming Rev. Larry, session welcomed new elders Noralee Manzek. Bud Martin, Bill Schroeher, Jim Middendorf, and Bill Bartlett. Session elected Art Charlton to continue as Clerk and Susan Mackay to continue as Treasurer for one-year terms.

Financial reports for May were distributed and discussed. In a related matter, it was noted that there is no money in the budget to do a professional audit (approx. \$7000) or review (approx. \$4500) for 2022. Instead, a three-member team will perform an in-house audit to be completed no later than August 31st. Elders Bill Schroeher and Jim Middendorf agreed to be on the team with a third person to be named later. Treasurer Susan Mackay and Office Administrator Jonathan Acheson will assist with accessing the information.

Ruthann Arras and Susan Mackay attended a meeting at Trinity Episcopal Church where a Trinity leader proposed a Lehigh Valley Pride event for downtown churches. A possible date would be in mid-August. Participation in this event was discussed and the session's response was positive, conditioned on further details of what is involved.

Nancy Udut, mission team leader updated session on plans for community outreach, suggesting the church be open on Heritage Day and planning to host another "neighborhood social" for the fall.

Elder Udut also suggested we resume sending postcards to new movers in the area. With so many new apartments and developments in and around Easton, this is one way to reach out. Elder Mackay offered to assist as she was involved in this program pre-Covid. Money is available in the community connections team budget line to pay for this for the rest of this year.

Every church family has a Deacon! Deacons will be calling members to chat, and share joys and concerns. You can expect a monthly or bi-monthly phone call from your Deacon.


DEACON HONEY


