#### A few Memorable days in June:

Flag Day, June 14 We commemorate the adoption of the Stars and Stripes as the official flag of the United States. Father's Day is celebrated on the 3rd Sunday, June 18. The first celebration honoring fathers was on June 19, 1910.

Juneteenth is celebrated on Monday, June 19. This is a Federal Holiday in the United States commemorating the emancipation of enslaved African Americans.

June is **PRIDE Month**, commemorating the Stonewall uprising, which began on June 28, 1969. PRIDE stands for:

Professionalism, Respect, Integrity, Diversity and Excellence and was originally adopted by USCF Medical Center 16 years ago.



#### A MESSAGE FROM SESSION

To increase communication with church members, *Soundings* will feature highlights from Session meetings each month. Here are items from the April and May Session meetings.

In April, Session bid goodbye to Pastor Stefanie Muntzel at this, her last Session meeting. She noted, "I am truly blessed to have worked with each of you."

In the interim of finding a new pastor, Rev. Matt Martis LaCroix of College Hill Presbyterian Church has agreed to cover pastoral care emergencies.

Due to the loss of our full-time pastor, the Session approved changes to the employment of Office Administrator Jonathan Acheson. Mr. Acheson's duties are expanded, his hours are increased from 20 hours/week to 28 hours/week, and his rate of pay increased to \$18/hour. Money for these changes is available by rearranging a few budget line items.

Rev. Rhonda Kruse, Transitional Leader of Lehigh and Lackawanna Presbyteries, shared information to help in our search for a temporary pastor. It was agreed that the church will look to fill a half-time (20 hours a week) position. Session agreed to schedule interviews with two candidates who are looking for such a position.

Rev. Kruse announced that the Presbytery proposes issuing a grant of \$25,000 to the church to offset the cost of hiring a half-time pastor, in lieu of renting rooms in the church since rentals are not a sure thing, there are limits in our ability to "encumber" the building, and there would be associated costs of such items as leasehold improvements, security upgrades, janitorial services, and legal fees.

Member Pat Koefoed, our Commissioner to Lehigh Presbytery, presented ideas for expanding our reach in the community by considering a free once a month "lunch or dinner church" open to all. Ms. Koefoed also encouraged members to join her in reading <u>Forty Days of Prayer</u> as we discern the future of our congregation.

Sunday, June 18 is the date for ordination and installation of the new class of Elders and Deacons.

Session discussed two candidates for part-time temporary pastor who were recently interviewed. The Session agreed to follow up one candidate by contacting references and meeting the candidate to discuss terms.


