A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Congregation:

I hope you will make time this season to be intentional in your spiritual growth and connection with God. There are numerous ways to observe Lent. Many people give up something they enjoy or indulge in too much. I am inviting all members and friends of our church to read scripture. I would ask that you commit to reading the entire book of John between March 6 and April 9. You need only read one chapter every weekday, setting aside 10 minutes at most. There are 21 chapters in the Gospel of John, so if you miss a day or two and skip St Patrick's Day, you can still read the entire book. Our lectionary readings in Sunday worship all come from the book of John this Lenten cycle.

As you read, consider keeping a journal. You can do so on your phone or the "good old-fashioned way" with a pen and paper. Reading scripture alone is meaningful. But I offer you a simple way to reflect on what you read. It is called the SOAP method:

S = Scripture

Read the chapter for the day. Copy a verse or phrase which catches your attention word for word into your journal.

O = Observe

What does this passage tell us about God? Our world? Ourselves?

A = Application

How might your life be different today because of what you have read?

- · What lessons are there to be learned; examples to be followed or avoided?
- · What promises are offered by God to be claimed and enjoyed?
- · What character trait of God revealed?
- · Are there any habits or daily acts to start, continue, or stop?

P = Prayer

Write out a prayer for yourself and others based on what you read today.

May God bless you with insight and a deepened sense of God's presence in this holy season.

Maundy Thursday, April 6 at 6:30PM Tenebrae: Service of Shadows

The name Tenebrae is the Latin word for "darkness" or "shadows," and has for centuries been applied to the ancient monastic night and early morning services of the last three days of Holy Week. This is a typical service but centered on scripture readings and the gradual extinguishing of candles and other lights until a single candle remains. Towards the end of the service, this candle is hidden, typifying the apparent victory of the forces of evil. At the very end, a loud noise is made, symbolizing the earthquake at the time of the resurrection (Matthew 28:2), the hidden candle is restored to its place, and by its light all depart in silence.

MISSION 22-23, JOINING HANDS TO SUPPORT CHILDREN

In March 2020 the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, formerly known as food stamps, included emergency allotments, as the spread of COVID-19 was entering the pandemic stage. Those emergency allotments ended on Wednesday, March 1, 2023. The U.S. Center on Budget and Policy Priorities estimates the average individual recipient will see SNAP support decline by \$90 a month and as much as \$250 in some cases. Advocates said the change will likely deal a major blow to low-income U.S. households struggling under inflationary strains.


