STEWARDSHIP AND FINANCE

Trusting in God, Growing in Faith "Faith, Hope and Love abide." - 1 Corinthians 13:13

As the end of summer approaches – and hopefully the end of 90+ degree heat – the Stewardship Team begins to think about our Stewardship Campaign for 2023. Stewardship Sunday will be **October 30** this year. Some things will remain the same, but some will be changing. Here is a preview of what to expect when you receive the first of two letters in mid-September:

1.) The most recent three-year Capital Campaign is concluding at the end of 2022. This will be the last multi-year campaign. If you need to complete your pledge, we strongly encourage you to do so before December. The pledge amount still to be collected is necessary to pay our mortgage through the end of the year. We are deeply thankful for the generous support of many.

2.) Just like most folks, the church has a mortgage. The current annual amount is \$37,188 (\$3099 per month). We have been paying the mortgage through multi-year Capital Campaigns. Starting in 2023, the Session (at the recommendation of the Finance Team) will ask for one-year "Mortgage Fund" pledges. Our goal is to raise money to pay this annual \$37,188 without using operating fund money. We can't fulfill our operations and missions without paying the mortgage. Support the operating fund with your pledge - and for those who can, please help to pay down our mortgage.

3.) Some things to know about our mortgage:

a.) Our interest rate is currently a low 2.897%. This rate will be held until November 2024.

b.) We are on track to reduce the principal amount of the mortgage to under \$500,000 by October of this year!!!

c.) Currently, over 60% of each mortgage payment is going to pay down principal.

d.) We are still receiving an annual rebate of approximately \$2000 that is

possible because church members and others have purchased CDs from the Presbyterian and Loan Program in support of our mortgage. We are receiving the highest percentage rebate offered – 1%. This rebate will decrease as we pay down the principal or if supporting CDs are cashed in.

The Operating Fund pledges, as always, are used to pay for the work of our church, including for programs, salaries, missions, utilities, etc. As a church we are committed to continue these good works in the face of increased costs due to inflation and other variables. We will ask those who regularly give to do their best to increase their pledges. And for those who have not pledged in the past, we will ask you to make a modest pledge. Even the very smallest amounts will make a difference when gathered together.


Save the Date!

FAITH IN DIALOGUE: A new partnership with College Hill PC

GOD, GUNS AND GRACE is a three-part symposium exploring gun violence. How should people of faith and good will respond to our nation's ongoing epidemic of gun violence? How do we even engage the conversation when the public square seems to be dominated by only the most strident religious perspectives? Join us this Fall for a series of gracious conversations about guns and the urgent work we can do together for the sake of safety and justice. Each session is a stand-alone presentation.

Session 1: A Question of Right(s): Constitutional and Religious Freedom in the Gun Debate

The Reverend Dr. Brett Hendrickson of Lafayette College will explore the religious roots of gun violence and the intersection of constitutional and religious freedoms.


FELLOWSHIP HOUR
