PASTOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE UPDATE

Thank you to everyone who participated in our Coffee & Conversations with the PNC in late August. Your views are already playing an important role in our search process. As we announced earlier this fall, the search for a pastor is similar to online dating. We fill out a profile, pastoral candidates fill out a profile, and a computer system makes appropriate matches (though each party can search on their own as well.) This system is most successful when the church's profile (The Ministry Information Form or MIF) gives as complete a picture of the congregation as possible, and between your input and our committee's prayerful work, we have done just that.

As of October 18, our MIF has been approved by both the Session and the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry. We are now in the process of making it available online. Once it has been uploaded, we will begin receiving information from candidates, bringing us one step closer to calling a full time pastor.

To some, this process may seem like a lot of bureaucratic red tape, but as 1 Timothy 5:22 reminds us, "Do not ordain anyone hastily..." We are not hiring a McDonald's manager – we are hiring a spiritual leader, and this process ensures that we are careful and diligent, always asking for God's guidance and oversight.
