PASTOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE UPDATE

This is an exciting time in the life of our church we are not only in the midst of a search for a new pastor, but we are also discerning what God has in store for us. In January, we elected a Pastoral Nominating Committee, or PNC, consisting of 7 members: our chair, Kimberlee Runnion; our clerk, Chris Gulotta; Al Rutherford; Kevin Joshua; Lindsey Rice; Phyllis Finger; and Darcel Bridges. We are also blessed to be working with the Rev. Susan Tindall, associate pastor College Hill at Presbyterian, who is our liaison from the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry.

Though we were elected at the beginning of the year, our work couldn't begin until Cindy's departure at the end of June. The search process for a pastor is quite different from a search process within a business. We must discern what God is calling our church to do and who God is calling to serve us while at the same time, pastoral candidates are trying to discern where God is calling them to serve. This is a time for us to examine our history and look to our future.

Luckily for you, the PNC does all the dirty work – we write what's called a Ministry Information Form, almost like a detailed online dating profile of

our church; we sift through Personal Information Forms from candidates; and we perform initial interviews, review background checks, and contact references. However, we don't make the ultimate decision. As our name indicates, we are the Pastoral *Nominating* Committee. In the end, we will present a nominee to the church, and the congregation decides whether or not to extend a call to the pastor.

This is a detailed process that typically takes a year to a year and a half, but it's important to remember that during that time, the life of our church goes forward – we aren't just in limbo! We are alive and thriving! A pastor doesn't make the church; we make the church, and we call a pastor to help us live out our mission and vision.

So what can you, as the congregation, do during this process?

- 1. Pray for the PNC. Pray that God will open our hearts and minds to hear that still, small voice of the Holy Spirit.
- 2. Invite your friends to join you at church. There's no reason we can't be welcoming new people into our midst during this process.
- 3. Ask around to see what you can do to help
 there are always plenty of jobs to be done
 in the life of a church, especially now!
- 4. Let us hear from you! Please do not hesitate to share any concerns about the process or ideas you have for our church.

May God bless us all with patience, wisdom, and peace throughout our search process.

Cash For Causes

We continue to participate in the Giant Food Stores "Cash for Causes" gift card program. Cards are available in \$25, \$50 and \$100 denominations. You can buy them on Sunday during Coffee Hour in Legacy Hall, or during the week from Nancy Penman in the church office. Pay with cash or by check made out to the church with "Giant gift card" in the memo line. The church earns 5%. Let's all participate!

Dry Cleanliness Is Next to Godliness

First Presbyterian Church partners with Al's Cleaners of Easton to raise funds for the church. Al's, located at 1134 Northampton Street, donates to the church 10 percent of what you spend on dry cleaning — all you have to do is mention "First Presbyterian Church of Easton" the first time you drop off your cleaning. Once your preference is recorded in their system, Al's Cleaners will automatically credit the church's account each time you bring in dry cleaning.
