WE HEAR GOD'S WORD

SCRIPTURE READING Matthew 25:31-46

Reader: When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates his sheep from the goats, and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. Then the king will say to those at his right hand,

Jesus/King: Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.

Reader: The righteous will then answer him,

Piano side: When, Lord, did we ever see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you a drink? When did we ever see you a stranger and welcome you in our homes, or naked and clothe you? When did we ever see you sick or in prison, and visit you?

Jesus/King: I tell you, whenever you did this for one of the least important of these members of my family, you did it for me!

Reader: Then he will say to those on his left,

Jesus/King: Away from me! I was hungry but you would not feed me, thirsty but you would not give me a drink; I was a stranger but you would not welcome me, naked but you would not clothe me; I was sick and in prison but you would not take care of me.

Reader: Then they will answer him,

Organ side: When, Lord, did we ever see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and would not help you?

Jesus/King: I tell you, whenever you refused to help one of these least important ones, you refused to help me.
