SCRIPTURE Acts 26:12-18, 20

"One day on my way to Damascus, armed as always with papers from the high priests authorizing my action, right in the middle of the day a blaze of light, light outshining the sun, poured out of the sky on me and my companions. Oh, King, it was so bright! We fell flat on our faces. Then I heard a voice in Hebrew: 'Saul, Saul, why are you out to get me? Why do you insist on going against the grain?'

"I said, 'Who are you, Master?'

"The voice answered, 'I am Jesus, the One you're hunting down like an animal. But now, up on your feet – I have a job for you. I've handpicked you to be a servant and witness to what's happened today, and to what I am going to show you. I'm sending you off to open the eyes of the outsiders so they can see the difference between dark and light, and choose light, see the difference between Satan and God, and choose God. I'm sending you off to present my offer of sins forgiven, and a place in the family, inviting them into the company of those who begin real living by believing in me.'

"I started preaching this life-change – this radical turn to God and everything it meant in everyday life – right there in Damascus, went on to Jerusalem and the surrounding countryside, and from there to the whole world."

### **WE RESPOND**

# THE PRAYER JESUS TAUGHT

This is a guided prayer/meditation structured around the Lord's Prayer. Take several deep breaths. Exhale and release stress; as you breathe in, imagine you are breathing in the light of God.

# Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name.

Name the good things in your life and thank God for them.

# Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Think about how God is working in your life; what might be God's will be for you? Ask God to help you be open and receptive to God's voice and direction.

### Give us this day our daily bread.

Lift up your needs, as well as the needs of those around you, to God – be they physical, emotional or spiritual. You may choose to pray for specific outcomes, or you may simply feel and describe the needs to God.

# Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.

Spend some time in retrospection, observing the ways in which you hurt others or yourself. Ask God for forgiveness, as well as help in forgiving others and forgiving yourself. Prayerfully let go of bitterness and resentment, and know that this may be a process. If you have felt hurt by God, name your feelings and lift them in prayer. God's love is big enough to hold all of them.

# And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.

Search inside your heart and find the sources of your fears, lifting them up in prayer. In what ways are those fears manifested in your life? Ask God to free you from those fears. While it is fine to ask God's help in preventing undesirable outcomes, consider also asking for God's peace no matter what happens – even if the worst nightmare comes true.

# For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever.

Take several deep breaths again as you surrender your innermost needs to God. If you tend to hold on to worries, consider tensing the muscles of your hands in a tight fist, and then suddenly releasing them. As you relax your hand, envision that you are letting go of your burdens. Ask for help in entrusting those burdens to God.
