Van Hise will provide hospital visitation and plans to be in the church office two half-days per week (days and hours to be determined).

Rev. Van Hise is a life-long Presbyterian, having served as a Clerk of Session and is an ordained Deacon and Elder as well as a Teaching Elder. A graduate of Rutgers College, he worked on Wall Street for the Bank of New York for 22 years and retired when the call from God to go to seminary could no longer be avoided. He has served numerous churches in New Jersey and Pennsylvania as an interim pastor. He and his wife Angie (also an ordained Presbyterian minister) retired to Moravian Village here in Bethlehem after selling their Angus beef farm near Hershey, PA. They are blessed with three daughters, a son-in-law and five grandchildren.

Constitutional Questions to Ruling Elders and Deacons

Do you trust in Jesus Christ your Savior, acknowledge him Lord of all and Head of the Church, and through him believe in One God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit?

Do you accept the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament to be, by the Holy Spirit, the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the Church universal, and God's Word to you?

Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God?

Will you fulfill your ministry in obedience to Jesus Christ, under the authority of Scripture, and be continually guided by our confessions?

Will you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline?

Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit?

Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world?

Do you promise to further the peace, unity and purity of the church?

Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination and love?

For Ruling Elders

Will you be a faithful Ruling Elder, watching over the people, providing for their worship, nurture and service?

Will you share in government and discipline, serving in the councils of the church and in your ministry, will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

For Deacons

Will you be a faithful Deacon, teaching charity, urging concern and directing the people's help to the friendless and those in need? In your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?
